# Parking Reminder

Please be aware that parking is not permitted on the sidewalk in the City of Pittsburgh. While it might seem logical to pull onto the sidewalk to give cars more room to pass, we ask that you *curb* this bad habit. Sidewalk parking destroys sidewalks and utility lines, is unsafe for pedestrians, and is illegal:

CHAPTER 541: GENERAL PARK-ING REGULATIONS

§ 541.01 PROHIBITIONS IN SPECIFIED PLACES.

Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or to protect the safety of any person or vehicle or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no operator of a vehicle shall, and no owner of a vehicle

shall allow the vehicle to:

- (a) Stop, stand or park a vehicle:
- (1) On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street except that a pedalcycle may be parked as provided in Vehicle Code 3509(b)(2).
- (2) On a sidewalk except that a pedalcycle may be parked as provided in Vehicle Code 3509(b)(2).

Remember that Morningside does not require parking permits. In fact, compared to many of the other city neighborhoods, we have relatively few parking woes!

# Do Not Call Registry

If you signed up for the National Do Not Call Registry when it first debuted five years ago, it's time to re-register your phone number.

When you register your phone number for free, it will remain on the national do-not-call list for five years. You may reenter your number on the list when the five years have passed, and you may remove your number from the list at any time.

The Do-Not-Call registry does not prevent **all** unwanted calls. It does not cover the following:

- calls from organizations with which you have established a business relationship;
- calls for which you have given prior written permission;

- calls which are not commercial or do not include unsolicited advertisements;
- calls by or on behalf of tax-exempt non-profit organizations.

How to register

Subscribers may register their residential telephone number, including wireless numbers, on the national Do-Not-Call registry by telephone or by Internet at no cost.

Consumers can register online for the national do-notcall registry by going to www.donotcall.gov. To register by telephone, consumers may call 1-888-382-1222: for TTY call 1-866-290-4236. You must call from the phone number you wish to register.

# Know More About Your Credit

With identity theft on the rise it is more important than ever to monitor your credit. FREE annual credit reports are available by calling toll-free 1-877-322-8228 or by visiting

<u>www.annualcreditreport.com</u>. Credit scores, usually available to lenders, are now *only* available for a fee. If you'd like to see your scores, you can order them for a *fee* from the credit bureaus—Equifax, Experian and TransUnion. Located on the corner of Stanton and Negley Avenues in Pittsburgh's East End, the Union Project is pleased to host this second annual event and invites Morningside and the Pittsburgh community to help determine the city's own "Duke of Ribs."

This year's "Duke of Ribs" will be judged by a panel of local celebrities including Tony Mowod. Executive Producer and Jazz Host of WQED 90.5 FM. Attendance for the event is free and open to the public. Five dollars will buy the public five rib tastings from competitors. Additional side dishes will be available through the Urban Fusion Café. Attendees will not only have the opportunity to sample the city's best ribs, but also to hear local DJ talent.

Entries for the rib chefs are still being accepted. Registration is \$25 for amateur chefs and \$75 for professionals and restaurants.
