Organize Your Block for National Night Out

August 5th, 5:00 pm - 8:00 pm

National Night Out is a great opportunity for Pittsburgh communities to promote neighborhood camaraderie and strong partnerships between residents and public safety personnel. This year the theme is "Safer Together," promoting our neighborhoods as safe places in which to live, work, study, and play.

While the traditional porch light vigil is still common today, many communities celebrate NNO by hosting picnics, cookouts, and block parties. Holding an NNO neighborhood event is a great way to meet new neighbors, celebrate the success of your community watch or block club, and strengthen your relation-

ships with city public safety departments. Last year, community groups throughout Pittsburgh hosted 42 events which were attended by 3,000 city residents.

Parking & Street Closures

The race course and affected streets will be the same as last year. The list below and map to the right outline all of the streets which will be affected and in what way.

- » **The Race Course** - Cars will not be able to park along the race course from 7:30am to approximately 10:00am on race day (Saturday, September 13th, 2014).
- » **Villanova Road and Bossart Street** - Cars may park on the street, but will not be able to drive to or from these blocks during the race.
- » **North of Greenwood Street (1800 and 1900 blocks of Chislett and Antietam, 6900 block of Greenwood, Bishop, Standish, Manistee and Witherspoon)** - Cars will be able to park on the street, but vehicles will not be able to pass through the intersection of Greenwood and Chislett during the race time. Gael Way will be open for those who need to exit.

In the case of any emergency at a home along the course or that is blocked by the course, the race will be paused and emergency vehicles will be allowed to proceed uninhibited.

2014 Mile Honoree: Frances Colletto

Each year, the race honors one individual from the Morningside area who has bravely and unselfishly served our country and/or its citizens. This year, tribute will be given to **Frances Colletto**. We thank Mrs. Colletto and her family for their sacrifices for our country and our city.

Mrs. Colletto's only son, Albert V. Colletto, Jr., was killed in action August 12, 1969. When she learned her son was killed in Vietnam, Mrs. Colletto started volunteering with the American Gold Star Mothers, a nonprofit service and support group for mothers of children who died in the military, and even became the president of the Allegheny County Chapter.

In addition to the Gold Star Mothers, Mrs. Colletto was active with Vietnam Veterans Inc., the Patriot Guard Riders, Rolling Thunder, and the Order of the Purple Heart.

The oldest registered Gold Star Mother in Pennsylvania and perhaps the nation, Frances DeCiancio Colletto died of complications from a stroke on Thursday, January 2, 2014. She was 99.

She is survived by daughters Carol Stewart of Morningside and Theresa Price of Gibsonia, her grandchildren, and many nephews and nieces.

Community Day Celebration to Follow the Race

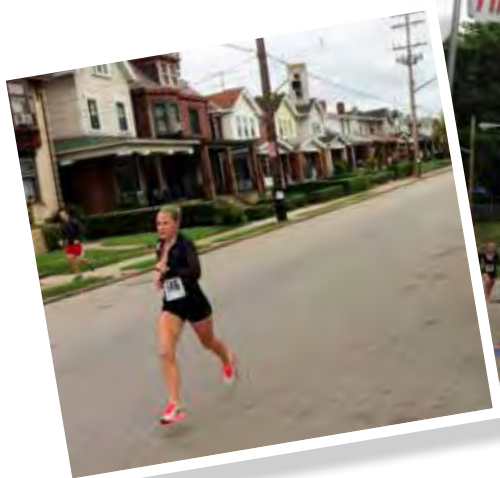

42nd Annual St. Raphael's Bazaar

August 7th - 10th, evenings

The 42nd annual St. Raphael Parish Bazaar will be held this year from August 7th to 10th. Activities begin at 7:00pm on weekdays and 6:00pm on weekends; the Bazaar wraps up at 10:30pm every day.

The Thursday evening parade has been discontinued, but join us for our regular festivities at St. Raphael's School - games

and amusements, kids zone, a food court that includes Polish and Italian foods, poker, music, a flea market, Chinese auction, raffles, bingo, and live music nightly.

A spaghetti dinner will be held on Sunday from 4:30pm to 6:30pm. It will include pasta, bread, salad, and drink (tea, lemonade, and water) for \$7.00 for adults and \$4.00 for kids 10 and under.

Sunday will coincide with the Saint Rocco Feast Day celebration on the grounds of St. Raphael Parish.
