- I. Welcome (start of meeting, 7:05 pm)

- III. Treasurer's Report (Jared Delaney)
  1. \$2,934 in operating account, \$2001 in savings.
- IV. State of Safety in Zone 5 & Morningside (Commander O'Connor)
  1. Morningside still lowest in crimes in Zone 5, mostly property-related.
  2. Twenty homicides in Zone 5 for the year.
  3. 15 additional officers in zone.
  4. Patrol of fields done once a night in Morningside, will continue.

  4. City steps have no budget in DPW operating budget.
  5. Paving complaints citywide, money available for 20 miles of paving.
