New Membership Levels for 2014

Each year the Morningside Area Community Council (MACC) hosts a variety of neighborhood events including the Morningside Messenger Newsletter, Trash Pick-up and Beautification Days, an Easter egg hunt, the Morningside Mile race, Falloween, and the Merry Morningside Caroling and Holiday Lights contest. Behind the scenes, MACC works to keep the lines of communication open with our city, state, and federal officials and advocates for business development and for funding that keeps our streets safe and our neighborhood beautiful.

Please help us continue our work for the neighborhood by joining MACC or renewing your membership. We are pleased to offer three levels of membership this year:

Project for Local Stormwater Management

Morningside residents will soon have the opportunity to request a rain barrel for their homes through **Project 15206**.

Stormwater is rainwater run-off from roofs, parking lots, and other impervious services. When not properly managed, stormwater can lead to polluted waterways, flooding, and erosion. *Green infrastructure* involves installing things such as rain barrels, rain gardens, and pervious pavements so that rainwater stays on site instead of flowing into the sewer system or a waterway. *Rain barrels* collect roof

water which can then be used later for gardening or other home activities.

Project 15206 is a stormwater management initiative led by Penn State Extension, Pittsburgh Community Services Inc., and State Senator Jim Ferlo, with participation from numerous government, philanthropic, non-profit, and community groups. The project focuses on installing green stormwater management infrastructure in the 15206 zip code.

Heth's/Natoli Fields Steering Committee Evaluates Field Use

A steering committee of representatives from sports teams and neighborhoods with ties to Heth's and Natoli Fields have provided input for better utilization and maintenance of the fields. The project addressed a recommendation of a recent strategic planning process.

From September to November 2013, four community meetings, several surveys, and interviews of neighborhood participants vetted priorities, wish lists, resident concerns, and short- and long-term development opportunities. Research of existing athletic association and sports

management organizations across the state also was conducted to help the committee evaluate field use models.



"This process was successful largely because representatives volunteered many hours for serious, collegial discussion with a willingness to move ahead for the betterment of the broader footprint surrounding the fields," said Grant Ervin, MACC president, who coordinated the project. "We owe these neighbors a debt of thanks."

After the final report has been presented to the steering committee for review and comment, it will be posted on the MACC website.
